



#16 Par 3 Black 175 Silver 163 White 154 Gold 133 Red 123 Blue 113

- The final par three is an excellent complement to a terrific group of one shot holes.
- The expanded green will be elevated, falling off to a low, thin, bunker on the left, and a wide, fairway cut, chipping area on the right. The edges of the putting surface will be clearly defined and an accurate tee shot will be required.
- Tee space will nearly double with the addition of a spacious forward tee.
- Aesthetics will improve by shifting the cart path out of view on the right and by buffering the left side with a native fescue area.
- Drainage basins will gather water as it moves across the area just short of the green complex.



#17 Par 4 Black 430 Silver 395 White 384 Gold 334 Red 297 Blue 254

- Sliding right and slightly downhill, the par four 17th favors a gentle left to right shape from the tee.
- The green complex will take on a new look as the right bunker expands and is cut into the ground.
- The front left bunker will be eliminated, replaced with a low fairway area, and a new catch bunker will push back to gather balls missed long and left.
- The putting surface will extend out the back, requiring a bold play and proper distance control to new hole locations cut deep into the rear section of the green.
- Added tees will both stretch and shorten play for members on both ends of the distance spectrum.



#18 Par 4 Black 434 Silver 364 White 349 Gold 302 Red 290 Blue 246

- With the clubhouse in sight, the 18th presents one final strong challenge as players must work their way up to the high ground of the green complex.
- A target bunker positioned on the left side will add perspective and definition to the fairway.
- By reconfiguring the area around the green complex, its challenges will become more evident. The right front bunker becomes more visible and the zone short and left of the green will stand out as the desired miss.
- By offsetting the bunkers, they are brought into play based on hole location and club selection, but can also be more easily avoided.
- The added back tee legitimizes this as a stern test during championships, while the new forward tee eases the final burden on this uphill par four.
